### Physical Plant

#### Law Library

- Prominent signage, picture, and plaque on wall at entry from Robert A. Levy Atrium on first floor
- \$5,000,000

#### Leadership Center

- Prominent signage, picture and plaque at entry from Robert A. Levy Atrium on first floor
- Newly re-configured space houses admissions, academic advising, and career counseling
- Occupies 2/3 of the old first floor of the library
- \$2,500,000

#### Main Reading Room in Law Library

- Beautiful open and bright study area in middle of second floor of reconfigured library
- Prominent signage at all entry points; picture and plaque at central location
- \$1,000,000

#### Seminar Room near Dean's Suite

- Designed for judicial education programs, attorneys general education programs, academic conferences, workshops, faculty meetings; this room routinely hosts the most influential visitors to the school
- Prominent signage in hallway; picture and plaque on wall in room
- \$1,000,000

#### Moot Courtroom

- Prominent signage in hallway; picture and plaque on wall in room
- \$1,000,000

#### Rear Atrium (Gallery)

- Prominent signage, picture, and plaque on wall at entry from Robert A. Levy Atrium on first floor
- Moot Courtrooms enter off of this space
- \$500,000

#### Dean's Suite and Dean's Office

- Prominent signage in hallway; picture and plaque on wall in room
- \$500,000

Dean's Conference Room in new Leadership Center on first floor

- Prominent signage in centerpiece glass-walled conference room
- \$150,000

Classrooms

- Prominent signage in hallway; picture and plaque on wall in room
- \$500,000: Large Classrooms (3)
- \$250,000: Medium Classrooms (5)
- \$100,000: Seminar Classrooms (4)

Various Faculty Offices (45)

- Prominent signage in hallway; plaque on wall in office
- \$50,000

Various Administrative Offices (20)

- Prominent signage in hallway; plaque on wall in room
- \$50,000

### **Endowed Professorships\***

\* There is considerable flexibility in the naming of endowed professorships, e.g.:

Endowed Eminent Professorships (Chairs and University Professors) (2)

- Designed to attract “Rock Star” professors to Mason’s Scalia Law
- After joining the faculty, the Dean would nominate the Eminent Professor for “University Professor” which is the highest rank professor at the University
- Contribution for an endowed eminent professorship: \$5,000,000

Endowed Distinguished Professor (Chairs) (5)

- Designed to attract established mid-career professors from other universities
- Contribution for an endowed distinguished professorship: \$3,000,000

Endowed Distinguished Research Professorships (Chairs) (10)

- Designed to retain Scalia Law’s highest performing professors
- Contribution for an endowed distinguished research professorship: \$1,500,000

Endowed Distinguished Teaching Professorships (Chairs) (5)

- Designed to recognize and retain Scalia Law’s best teachers
- Contribution for an endowed teaching professorship: \$1,500,000

Endowed Distinguished Visiting Professorships (Visiting Chairs) (1)

- Goal is to increase the national reputation of Mason’s Scalia Law by having prominent professors visit the law school on an annual basis
- Contribution for an endowed visiting professorship: \$1,500,000

## Endowed Distinguished Adjunct Professorships (5)

- Provide for the hiring of justices, judges and other public servants to teach part-time in the law school
- Contribution for an endowed distinguished adjunct professorship: \$500,000

## Research Centers

### Law & Economics Center

- Mason Law's Flagship Research and Outreach Center, founded by Henry G. Manne in 1974
- Annual budget: \$6,000,000
- Naming of LEC: \$10 million
- Naming of Judicial Education Program: \$2,000,000
  - The LEC has been educating judges for over 40 years
  - Thousands of Federal and State Judges have participated
- Naming of Attorneys General Education Program: \$2,000,000
  - The LEC has been educating state AGs and their senior staff since 2010
- Program on Economics and Privacy
  - Promotes the sound application of economic analysis to issues surrounding the digital information economy through original research, policy outreach, and education. The PEP is dedicated to studying the economic tradeoffs inherent to privacy, data security, and other digital information debates, and to produce relevant and original research and education programs for policymakers.
  - Cost of naming Program on Economics and Privacy: \$1,500,000
  - Annual Budget: \$500,000

### Center for Protection of Intellectual Property

- Founded in 2013, CPIP is a strong voice for protecting intellectual property rights through sponsored research, high level conferences, and timely public policy programs
- Annual budget: \$2,800,000
- Naming of CPIP: \$6,000,000
- Naming of Arts & Entertainment Advocacy Clinic (operated under CPIP): \$1,000,000
  - Annual Budget: \$200,000

### Global Antitrust Institute

- Spun off from LEC in 2016, the GAI sponsors research on the global antitrust law and economics and also offers programs around the globe for foreign judges and regulators on the economics of alternative antitrust policies.
- Annual budget: \$2,500,000
- Naming of GAI: \$6 million

### Center for the Study of the Administrative State

- Established in 2015, CSAS has quickly become a national leader in relevant and rigorous academic research on timely issues related to the growth of the administrative state
- Annual Budget: \$1,800,000
- Naming of CSAS: \$6,000,000
- Naming of Administrative Law Clinic: \$1,500,000
  - Established in January 2017
  - Annual Budget of \$300,000

#### National Security Institute

- Established in January 2017
- Projected Annual Budget: \$2,500,000
- Naming of NSI: \$6,000,000

#### Center for Liberty & Law

- The Center for Liberty & Law will offer programs that support law students with a demonstrated interest in individual liberty, personal opportunity, limited government and the Rule of Law
- Naming of Center: \$6,000,000

### Clinics and Programs

#### Access to Justice Center

- An umbrella center for clinics devoted to protecting rights of low-income individuals through a neutral and nondiscriminatory process that determines the facts, applies the fair rule of law, and enforces the result
- Naming of Access to Justice Center: 3,000,000
- Mason Veterans and Servicemembers Legal Clinic (M-VETS)
  - Our nation's first legal clinic focused on protecting the rights of veterans, servicemembers and their families
  - Annual Budget: \$400,000
  - Naming of M-VETS: \$2,000,000
- Consumer Law Clinic
  - Examines several areas of consumer protection law, including entry into the market, unfair and deceptive practices, interference with business relations, trade secrets, and misappropriation
  - Cost of naming clinic: \$2,000,000
- Employment Law Clinic
  - Governs the rights and duties between employers and workers
  - Cost of naming clinic: \$2,000,000
- Immigration Law Clinic
  - Issues in immigration law of inadmissibility and deportability, relief from removal, asylum and refugee status, citizenship, nonimmigrant and immigrant visas, including labor certification, and administrative and judicial review
  - Cost of naming clinic: \$2,000,000
- Consumer Bankruptcy and Debtors Rights Clinic
  - Considers bankruptcy liquidation and reorganization, as well as the role of the courts and trustees in the bankruptcy process
  - Cost of naming clinic: \$2,000,000

#### Supreme Court Clinic

- Provides *pro bono* legal representation of clients in appeals to the Supreme Court of the United States
- Annual Budget: \$400,000
- Naming of clinic: \$2,000,000

#### Law and Mental Illness Clinic

- Gain practical experience in the judicial, legislative, academic, and advocacy aspects of the law concerning the treatment of individuals with severe mental illness
- Cost of naming clinic: \$2,000,000

#### Patent Applications Clinic

- Write actual applications that will be filed for inventors
- Cost of naming clinic: \$2,000,000

### Scholarships

#### Scalia Scholars

- Merit-based scholarships intended to boost Scalia Law in the rankings over a five-year period
- \$30,000,000

#### Endowed Named Scholars (26)

- Each scholarship provides one year of in-state tuition in perpetuity
- \$500,000 per named scholarship

#### Dean's Scholars (36)

- Highly selective scholarship fund for the Dean to attract top outstanding students from throughout the United States. Student recipients of scholarships are identified.
- \$240,000 supports two out-of-state students for three years

#### Commonwealth Scholars (400)

- Term scholarship designed to attract best and brightest students from throughout the Commonwealth of Virginia
- \$150,000 supports two in-state students for three years

#### Public Service Loan Forgiveness Fund (100)

- Offers loan forgiveness for graduates who go into public service jobs
- \$120,000
